





GIRM 277

- * The Priest, having put incense into the thurible, blesses it with the Sign of the Cross, without saying anything.
- * Before and after an incensation, a profound bow is made to the person or object that is incensed, except for the altar and the offerings for the Sacrifice of the Mass.
- * Three swings of the thurible are used to incense: the Most Blessed Sacrament, a relic of the Holy Cross and images of the Lord exposed for public veneration, the offerings for the Sacrifice of the Mass, the altar cross, the Book of the Gospels, the paschal candle, the Priest, and the people.

GIRM 277

- * Two swings of the thurible are used to incense relics and images of the Saints exposed for public veneration; this should be done, however, only at the beginning of the celebration, following the incensation of the altar.
- * The altar is incensed with single swings of the thurible in this way:
- * a) if the altar is freestanding with respect to the wall, the Priest incenses walking around it;
- * b) if the altar is not freestanding, the Priest incenses it while walking first to the right hand side, then to the left.

GIRM 277

- * The cross, if situated on the altar or near it, is incensed by the Priest before he incenses the altar; otherwise, he incenses it when he passes in front of it.
- * The Priest incenses the offerings with three swings of the thurible or by making the Sign of the Cross over the offerings with the thurible before going on to incense the cross and the altar.

Vestments

- * Amice
- * Alb
- * Cincture
- * Stole
- * Chasuble




Maniple

- * 1967 Tres abhinc annos: "no longer required"
- * 1969/2002 GIRM 119: prepare in the sacristy "the alb, the stole, and the chasuble"
- * 1969/2002 GIRM 336: an amice if the alb does "not completely cover the ordinary clothing at the neck," an alb "tied at the waist with a cincture unless it is made so as to fit without such"




Cope

- * GIRM 341: "The cope is worn by the Priest in processions and during other sacred actions, in accordance with the rubrics proper to the individual rites."
- Optional on Presentation of the Lord, Palm Sunday, weddings outside of mass, committal




Eyes

- * Eucharistic Prayer I: "with eyes raised to heaven"
- Addressing the people, addressing God
- * During the readings
- * Where to set the missal



Hands

- * Folded
- * Extended
 - Palm facing palm at shoulders
 - * "Goal" or "Don't Shoot"
 - One-armed extension
 - * Open wide
 - * Moving arms while speaking
- Greeting v prayer




Who You Are

- * Celebrant, not celebrity
 - Beware delivering sports scores, weather reports, standup comedy
 - Beware distractions in processions
- * It's not about you
- * Tenure




Give meaning to the scripted words

- Know the purpose of the prayer
 - When giving thanks, give thanks
 - When making a request, know what it is
- Make dialogues sincere




Focus

- * Do one thing at a time
- * Participate in singing
- Minimize inessential comments
- * Mind the microphone




Singing

* GIRM 147: It is most appropriate that the Priest sing those parts of the Eucharistic Prayer for which musical notation is provided.



Hospitality

- Meeting people before mass begins
- Welcome groups after the greeting
- Respect people's time to change postures
- Beware confusing homilies with after-dinner speeches



GIRM 34-35

Since the celebration of Mass by its nature has a "communitarian" character, both the dialogues between the Priest and the assembled faithful, and the acclamations are of great significance; for they are not simply outward signs of communal celebration but foster and bring about communion between Priest and people.

The acclamations and the responses of the faithful to the Priest's greetings and prayers constitute that level of active participation that is to be made by the assembled faithful in every form of the Mass, so that the action of the whole community may be clearly expressed and fostered.

Share ministries

- * Sacristan duties
- * Antiphons, songs
- * Third Penitential Act
- * Readings, Petitions
- * Procession of the gifts
- Starting the Confiteor, Gloria, Creed, Memorial Acclamation, and Lamb of God



Beware of additions

- Devotional prayers and actions
 - * Hail Mary
 - * St. Michael
- The liturgy has its own integrity
 - Love leading this prayer



Integrate your role

- * Inside and outside the liturgy, be a source of unity
- * Be a prayerful person
- * Be a serving person
- Be penitent and forgiving
- * Be a source of communion and sacrifice
