Celebrating Catholic funerals in the face of secularism, COVID and other challenges





Endorsed by the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference Over the past several decades, the Catholic Church's *Order of Christian Funerals* has not changed, but the culture surrounding funerals has. For example, people are thinking differently about cremation, the timing of the funeral, the nature of the service, the location of the funeral, and the final disposition of remains. This presentation will review key points from the funeral tradition and engage ways to make it more meaningful.

Father Paul Turner is pastor of Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Kansas City, Missouri USA and director of the Office of Divine Worship for the Catholic Diocese of Kansas City-St Joseph. He holds

a doctorate in sacred theology from Sant' Anselmo in Rome. He is a former president of the North American Academy of Liturgy, a member of Societas Liturgica, and the Catholic Academy of Liturgy. He is the recipient of the Jubilate Deo Award from the National Association of Pastoral Musicians and the Frederick McManus Award from the Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions. He serves as a facilitator for the International Commission on English in the Liturgy. His publications include Ars Celebrandi: Celebrating and Concelebrating Mass (Liturgical, 2021), New Church, New Altar A Commentary on the Order of Dedication of a Church and an Altar (Liturgical, 2021), Light in the Darkness: Preparing Better Catholic Funerals (Liturgical, 2017) and dozens of other titles.
